15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
17	Article - Public Safety

19	(a) (1) The Department shall adopt by regulation, as the Maryland Building
20	Performance Standards, the International Building Code, including the International
21	Energy Conservation Code, with the modifications incorporated by the Department under
22	subsection (b) of this section.
23	(2) The Department shall adopt each subsequent version of the Standards
24	within [12 months] 18 MONTHS after it is issued.

- 2 (a) (1) (i) Each local jurisdiction shall implement and enforce the most 3 current version of the Standards and any local amendments to the Standards.
- 4 (ii) Any modification of the Standards adopted by the State after
- 5 December 31, 2009, shall be implemented and enforced by a local jurisdiction no later than
- 6 [6 months] 12 MONTHS after the modifications are adopted by the State.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2015.
