HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

Moratorium on Taxes and Regulations

FOR the purpose of committing to the residents of the State that there will be a 4-year moratorium on increasing any existing taxes, establishing any new taxes, and mandating any additional regulations.

WHEREAS, State residents and businesses have absorbed many regulations, taxes, and fees in recent years, contributing to the sluggish growth of the State due to stifled investment in the State economy and leading residents to consider departing for other states with lower tax burdens; and

WHEREAS, A commitment to halt further tax increases and restrictive regulations would provide weary State residents and businesses relief following previous successive years of fiscal and regulatory encroachments and allow the General Assembly pause to examine the existing fiscal and business climate and identify ways to ease the burdens placed on State residents and businesses; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the members of the Maryland General Assembly commit to the residents of the State that there will be a 4-year moratorium on increasing any existing taxes, establishing any new taxes, and mandating any additional regulations; and be it further
