## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Health Occupations – Pharmacists – Refills of Prescriptions During State of**  
3 **Emergency**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the circumstances under which a pharmacist, during a state  
5 of emergency, may refill a prescription for a drug for which the refill has not been  
6 authorized; providing that a pharmacist who is working in Maryland, instead of the  
7 area declared an emergency, may refill the prescription if the federal or any state  
8 government, instead of the federal or this State's government, declares a state of  
9 emergency; increasing the maximum quantity of the drug that may be dispensed  
10 under the prescription refill; and generally relating to refills of prescriptions during  
11 a state of emergency.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 **Article – Health Occupations**

1 (a) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated.

2 (k) "State" means:

3 (1) A state, possession, or territory of the United States;

4 (2) The District of Columbia; or

5 (3) The Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

7 (c) If the federal or [State] A STATE government declares a state of emergency, a  
8 pharmacist working in [the area declared an emergency] MARYLAND may refill a  
9 prescription for a drug for which the refill has not been authorized if:

10 (1) As a result of the emergency, the pharmacist is unable to obtain an  
11 authorization from the authorized prescriber;

12 (2) The refill of the prescription is not for a controlled dangerous substance;

13 (3) The quantity dispensed does not exceed a [14-day] 30-DAY supply or  
14 unit of use; and

15 (4) The pharmacist notifies the authorized prescriber of the refill of the  
16 prescription within 7 days of dispensing the drug.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
18 October 1, 2015.
