CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Institutions of Higher Education – Fully Online Distance Education – Definition**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “fully online distance education program” as
4 it relates to the registration of institutions of higher education that offer certain
5 online distance education programs in the State; and generally relating to
6 institutions of higher education and fully online distance education in the State.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Education**

15 11–202.2.

16 (a) (1) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

17 (2) “Fully online distance education program in the State” means a
18 program, originating outside the State, offered by an out-of-state institution in which [a]:

1 (I) A student domiciled in Maryland enrolls[, where];

2 (II) 51% or more of the program is offered through electronic
3 distribution; AND

4 (III) **THE COMMISSION DETERMINES THAT THE PORTION OF THE**
5 **PROGRAM OFFERED AT A LOCATION IN THE STATE, IF ANY, DOES NOT REQUIRE A**
6 **CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL UNDER § 11-202 OF THIS SUBTITLE FOR THE**
7 **INSTITUTION TO OPERATE IN THE STATE.**

8 (3) “Out-of-state institution” means an institution of higher education
9 whose primary campus exists outside Maryland and whose authority to grant degrees is
10 conferred by another state.

11 (b) (1) An institution of higher education that enrolls Maryland students in a
12 fully online distance education program in the State shall file an application to register
13 with the Commission before or within 3 months of enrolling the first Maryland student.

14 (2) This section does not apply to an institution of higher education that
15 enrolls Maryland students in a fully online distance education program in the State that:

16 (i) Is subject to program review by the Commission under § 11-206
17 or § 11-206.1 of this subtitle; or

18 (ii) Participates in the Southern Regional Education Board’s
19 Electronic Campus.

20 (3) (i) After filing an application under paragraph (1) of this subsection,
21 an institution that has enrolled a Maryland student before obtaining a registration under
22 this section may continue to operate without a registration while the Commission considers
23 the institution’s application, conducts a hearing concerning the institution’s application, or
24 participates in judicial review regarding an institution’s application.

25 (ii) An institution that continues to operate without a registration
26 under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall furnish a performance bond or other form
27 of financial guarantee to the State in an amount set by regulation that is in addition to and
28 separate from a performance bond or other form of financial guarantee required under §
29 11-203 of this subtitle.

30 (c) Each institution of higher education required to register under this section
31 shall:

32 (1) Be accredited by an accrediting body recognized and approved by the
33 United States Department of Education;

1 (2) Submit to the Commission:

2 (i) Every 2 years, a financial statement reviewed by an independent
3 accountant retained by the institution;

4 (ii) An affidavit from the president or chief executive officer of the
5 institution affirming:

6 1. That the institution has not filed for bankruptcy
7 protection under Title 11 of the United States Code during its existence; and

8 2. The willingness of the president or the chief executive
9 officer to abide by the provisions of this section;

10 (iii) Proof of good business standing in the state in which the central
11 administration of the institution is incorporated; and

12 (iv) Proof of good academic standing submitted by:

13 1. The regulatory higher education entity in the state in
14 which the central administration of the institution is located; or

15 2. If the state in which the institution is located does not
16 have a regulatory higher education entity, the accrediting body that accredited the
17 institution;

18 (3) Promptly notify the Commission of a change in ownership or a change
19 in majority control;

20 (4) Comply with the Principles of Good Practice for distance education
21 established by the Commission through regulation;

22 (5) Make public and post on the institution's Web site:

23 (i) Whether the institution is registered in Maryland; and

24 (ii) The process by which to make complaints against the institution;

25 (6) Comply with the refund policy and procedures established by the
26 Commission; and

27 (7) Be subject to complaint investigation by the Office of the Attorney
28 General or the Commission or both.

29 (d) The refund policy and procedures established by the Commission shall allow
30 for:

1 (1) (i) At least 2 weeks of required orientation or preenrollment
2 instruction in a fully online distance education program in the State at no charge for a
3 student who has completed less than 24 credits of college-level learning from an accredited
4 institution; and

5 (ii) A prorated refund methodology that provides a refund to any
6 student not covered by item (i) of this paragraph who has completed 60% or less of a course,
7 term, or program within the applicable billing period; or

8 (2) A prorated refund methodology that provides a refund to any student
9 who has completed 60% or less of a course, term, or program within the applicable billing
10 period.

11 (e) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Commission shall
12 require the payment of a fee set by regulation, as a condition of registration.

13 (2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the fees charged
14 shall be:

15 1. A fixed amount for all institutions regardless of type,
16 location, or student enrollment; and

17 2. Set to cover the approximate cost of implementing a
18 system of registration.

19 (ii) Notwithstanding subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the
20 Commission may charge an institution that enrolls not more than 20 Maryland students a
21 fee that is less than the amount of the fee charged to other institutions.

22 (f) The Commission shall make public and post on its Web site:

23 (1) A list of registered institutions of higher education that offer fully
24 online distance education programs in the State; and

25 (2) If the Commission denies or revokes the registration of an institution,
26 the name of the denied or revoked institution.

27 (g) On or before December 1 each year, the Commission shall report to the
28 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General
29 Assembly:

30 (1) The number of institutions of higher education that apply for
31 registration under this section;

32 (2) The type and size of the institutions that apply;

33 (3) The number of institutions approved for registration;

- 1 (4) The number of institutions denied registration;
- 2 (5) The number of Maryland students enrolled in institutions required to
3 register under this section;
- 4 (6) The results of the requirements of § 11–202.3 of this subtitle;
- 5 (7) The number of institutions found to be in violation of the requirement
6 to register under this section;
- 7 (8) Any fines imposed, and in what amounts, on institutions that violate
8 this section; and
- 9 (9) Any fine revenues collected from institutions for violation of this
10 section.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 ~~October~~ June 1, 2015.
