A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Stormwater Management – Watershed Protection and Restoration Program –**
3 **Repeal**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that on or before a certain date a county or
5 municipality subject to a certain municipal stormwater permit adopt and implement
6 laws or ordinances to establish a watershed protection and restoration program;
7 repealing the exemption of a county or municipality from certain requirements if the
8 county or municipality has enacted and implemented a certain system of charges in
9 a certain manner on or before a certain date; repealing the requirement that a county
10 or municipality maintain or administer a local watershed protection and restoration
11 fund in accordance with certain provisions of law; repealing the requirement that a
12 county or municipality establish and annually collect a stormwater remediation fee
13 in accordance with certain provisions of law; repealing the requirement that a county
14 or municipality establish certain policies and procedures to reduce a certain
15 stormwater remediation fee to account for certain measures; repealing certain
16 provisions of law relating to the prohibition against the assessment of a stormwater
17 remediation fee on a property by both a county and a municipality; repealing the
18 requirement that a county or municipality determine the method, frequency, and
19 enforcement of the collection of the stormwater remediation fee; repealing the
20 requirement that certain money be deposited in a local watershed protection and
21 restoration fund; repealing certain provisions of law relating to the uses of money in
22 a local watershed protection and restoration fund; repealing the requirement that a
23 county or municipality make publicly available a certain report beginning on a
24 certain date; repealing the requirement that a county or municipality establish a
25 certain hardship exemption program; repealing the authorization of the Department
26 of the Environment to adopt certain regulations; altering the definition of a certain
27 term; repealing the definition of a certain term; and generally relating to stormwater
28 management in the State.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article – Environment**

12 4–201.1.

13 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

14 (b) “Environmental site design” means using small–scale stormwater
15 management practices, nonstructural techniques, and better site planning to mimic
16 natural hydrologic runoff characteristics and minimize the impact of land development on
17 water resources.

18 (c) “Environmental site design” includes:

19 (1) Optimizing conservation of natural features, such as drainage patterns,
20 soils, and vegetation;

21 (2) Minimizing use of impervious surfaces, **SUCH AS PAVED SURFACES,**
22 **CONCRETE CHANNELS, ROOFS, AND PIPES;**

23 (3) Slowing down runoff to maintain discharge timing and to increase
24 infiltration and evapotranspiration; and

25 (4) Using other nonstructural practices or innovative stormwater
26 management technologies approved by the Department.

27 [(d) (1) “Impervious surface” means a surface that does not allow stormwater
28 to infiltrate into the ground.

29 (2) “Impervious surface” includes rooftops, driveways, sidewalks, or
30 pavement.]

31 [4–202.1.

1 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, this section
2 applies to a county or municipality that is subject to a national pollutant discharge
3 elimination system Phase I municipal separate storm sewer system permit.

4 (2) This section does not apply to a county or municipality that, on or before
5 July 1, 2012, has enacted and implemented a system of charges under § 4–204 of this
6 subtitle for the purpose of funding a watershed protection and restoration program, or
7 similar program, in a manner consistent with the requirements of this section.

8 (b) On or before July 1, 2013, a county or municipality shall adopt and implement
9 local laws or ordinances necessary to establish a watershed protection and restoration
10 program.

11 (c) A watershed protection and restoration program established under this
12 section shall include:

13 (1) A stormwater remediation fee; and

14 (2) A local watershed protection and restoration fund.

15 (d) (1) A county or municipality shall maintain or administer a local
16 watershed protection and restoration fund in accordance with this section.

17 (2) The purpose of a local watershed protection and restoration fund is to
18 provide financial assistance for the implementation of local stormwater management plans
19 through stormwater management practices and stream and wetland restoration activities.

20 (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection and subsection
21 (f) of this section, a county or municipality shall establish and annually collect a stormwater
22 remediation fee from owners of property located within the county or municipality in
23 accordance with this section.

24 (2) Property owned by the State, a unit of State government, a county, a
25 municipality, or a regularly organized volunteer fire department that is used for public
26 purposes may not be charged a stormwater remediation fee under this section.

27 (3) (i) A county or municipality shall set a stormwater remediation fee
28 for property in an amount that is based on the share of stormwater management services
29 related to the property and provided by the county or municipality.

30 (ii) A county or municipality may set a stormwater remediation fee
31 under this paragraph based on:

32 1. A flat rate;

33 2. An amount that is graduated, based on the amount of
34 impervious surface on each property; or

1 (iii) Require a property owner to hire a third party, certified by the
2 Department, to conduct an on-site inspection and provide to the county or municipality the
3 results of the inspection and any other information required by the county or municipality.

4 (g) (1) A property may not be assessed a stormwater remediation fee by both
5 a county and a municipality.

6 (2) (i) Before a county may impose a stormwater remediation fee on a
7 property located within a municipality, the county shall:

8 1. Notify the municipality of the county's intent to impose a
9 stormwater remediation fee on property located within the municipality; and

10 2. Provide the municipality reasonable time to pass an
11 ordinance authorizing the imposition of a municipal stormwater remediation fee instead of
12 a county stormwater remediation fee.

13 (ii) If a county currently imposes a stormwater remediation fee on
14 property located within a municipality and the municipality decides to implement its own
15 stormwater remediation fee under this section or § 4-204 of this subtitle, the municipality
16 shall:

17 1. Notify the county of the municipality's intent to impose its
18 own stormwater remediation fee; and

19 2. Provide the county reasonable time to discontinue the
20 collection of the county stormwater remediation fee within the municipality before the
21 municipality's stormwater remediation fee becomes effective.

22 (3) A county or municipality shall establish a procedure for a property
23 owner to appeal a stormwater remediation fee imposed under this section.

24 (h) (1) A county or municipality shall determine the method, frequency, and
25 enforcement of the collection of the stormwater remediation fee.

26 (2) A county or municipality shall deposit the stormwater remediation fees
27 it collects into its local watershed protection and restoration fund.

28 (3) There shall be deposited in a local watershed protection and restoration
29 fund:

30 (i) Funds received from the stormwater remediation fee;

31 (ii) Interest or other income earned on the investment of money in
32 the local watershed protection and restoration fund; and

1 (iii) Any additional money made available from any sources for the
2 purposes for which the local watershed protection and restoration fund has been
3 established.

4 (4) Subject to paragraph (5) of this subsection, a county or municipality
5 shall use the money in its local watershed protection and restoration fund for the following
6 purposes only:

7 (i) Capital improvements for stormwater management, including
8 stream and wetland restoration projects;

9 (ii) Operation and maintenance of stormwater management systems
10 and facilities;

11 (iii) Public education and outreach relating to stormwater
12 management or stream and wetland restoration;

13 (iv) Stormwater management planning, including:

14 1. Mapping and assessment of impervious surfaces; and

15 2. Monitoring, inspection, and enforcement activities to carry
16 out the purposes of the watershed protection and restoration fund;

17 (v) To the extent that fees imposed under § 4–204 of this subtitle are
18 deposited into the local watershed protection and restoration fund, review of stormwater
19 management plans and permit applications for new development;

20 (vi) Grants to nonprofit organizations for up to 100% of a project's
21 costs for watershed restoration and rehabilitation projects relating to:

22 1. Planning, design, and construction of stormwater
23 management practices;

24 2. Stream and wetland restoration; and

25 3. Public education and outreach related to stormwater
26 management or stream and wetland restoration; and

27 (vii) Reasonable costs necessary to administer the local watershed
28 protection and restoration fund.

29 (5) A county or municipality may use its local watershed protection and
30 restoration fund as an environmental fund, and may deposit to and expend from the fund
31 additional money made available from other sources and dedicated to environmental uses,
32 provided that the funds received from the stormwater remediation fee are expended only
33 for the purposes authorized under paragraph (4) of this subsection.

1 (6) The funds disbursed under this subsection are intended to be in
2 addition to any existing State or local expenditures for stormwater management.

3 (7) Money in a local watershed protection and restoration fund may not
4 revert or be transferred to the general fund of any county or municipality.

5 (i) Beginning July 1, 2014, and every 2 years thereafter, a county or municipality
6 shall make publicly available a report on:

7 (1) The number of properties subject to a stormwater remediation fee;

8 (2) The amount of money deposited into the watershed protection and
9 restoration fund over the previous 2 fiscal years; and

10 (3) The percentage of funds in the local watershed protection and
11 restoration fund spent on each of the purposes provided in subsection (h)(4) of this section.

12 (j) (1) A county or municipality shall establish a program to exempt from the
13 requirements of this section a property able to demonstrate substantial financial hardship
14 as a result of the stormwater remediation fee.

15 (2) A county or municipality may establish a separate hardship exemption
16 program or include a hardship exemption as part of a system of offsets established under
17 subsection (f)(1) of this section.

18 (k) The Department may adopt regulations to implement and enforce this
19 section.]

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
21 1, 2015.
