1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore County - Public High Schools - Adoption of School Schedule

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a public high school in Baltimore County to adopt a school schedule for that school; authorizing certain parties to initiate a change to a certain 4 5 school schedule; requiring the principal of a certain school to convene a school 6 schedule committee for a certain purpose under certain circumstances; providing for 7 the composition and election and appointment of certain members of a school 8 schedule committee; providing for the duties of a school schedule committee; 9 requiring the adoption of a certain school schedule by a certain vote; requiring 10 certain schools to send a copy of a certain school schedule to the Baltimore County 11 Superintendent of Schools and the Baltimore County Board of Education within a 12 certain period of time; requiring a certain schedule to be effective for a certain period 13 of time; and generally relating to the adoption of school schedules by public high 14 schools in Baltimore County.

- 5 (H) A SCHEDULE ADOPTED BY A PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE EFFECTIVE BEGINNING IN THE NEXT SCHOOL YEAR FOR THE 7 ENTIRE SCHOOL YEAR.
