A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Behavioral Health Administration – Behavioral Health Advisory Council

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Behavioral Health Advisory Council in the Office of 4 the Governor; providing for the purpose, duties, and membership of the Council; $\mathbf{5}$ requiring the Council to appoint the chair of the Council; providing for the terms of 6 members; authorizing the Council to adopt certain procedures; authorizing the chair 7 to designate certain individuals to serve on a committee or task force of the Council; 8 requiring the Council to meet at least a certain number of times a year; providing 9 that a member may not receive compensation as a member of the Council but is entitled to certain reimbursement for expenses; requiring the Behavioral Health 10 11 Administration to provide certain staff for the Council; repealing the Maryland 12Advisory Council on Mental Hygiene and the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council; 13 making certain conforming changes; and generally relating to the Behavioral Health 14 Advisory Council.
