BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Personnel and Pensions Section 20-206 Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2014 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**


