18 19	(a) In this section, "Central Repository" means the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.

- 1 (c) As part of the application for a criminal history records check, the Secretary 2 shall submit to the Central Repository:
- 3 (1) two complete sets of the applicant's legible fingerprints taken on forms 4 approved by the Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal Bureau 5 of Investigation;
- 6 (2) the fee authorized under § 10–221(b)(7) of the Criminal Procedure 7 Article for access to Maryland criminal history records; and
- 8 (3) the mandatory processing fee required by the Federal Bureau of 9 Investigation for a national criminal history records check.
- 10 (d) In accordance with §§ 10–201 through 10–234 of the Criminal Procedure 11 Article, the Central Repository shall forward to the applicant and the Secretary a printed 12 statement of the applicant's criminal history record information.
- 13 (e) Information obtained from the Central Repository under this section:
- 14 (1) is confidential and may not be disseminated; and
- 15 (2) shall be used only for the licensing purpose authorized by this section.
- 16 (f) The subject of a criminal history records check under this section may contest 17 the contents of the printed statement issued by the Central Repository as provided in § 18 10–223 of the Criminal Procedure Article.
- 19 (G) FOR AN EMPLOYEE OF AN ARMORED CAR COMPANY WHO IS AN APPLICANT FOR A PERMIT, THE SECRETARY MAY ACCEPT A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION PERFORMED ON BEHALF OF THE ARMORED CAR COMPANY IN PLACE OF THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION IF:
- 23 (1) THE CRIMINAL BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION MEETS THE 24 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE; 25 AND
- 26 (2) THE SECRETARY PERFORMS A CURSORY CHECK TO VERIFY THE 27 FACTS LISTED IN THE CRIMINAL BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2015.
