Protective Order and Peace Order Petitions - Maryland Residents

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the filing of a protective order petition if the abuse is alleged to have occurred in the State or if the person eligible for relief is a resident 4 5 of the State; authorizing the filing of a peace order petition if a certain act is alleged 6 to have occurred in the State or if the petitioner is a resident of the State; declaring 7 that it is the intent of the General Assembly that an order for protection issued by a court of this State shall be accorded full faith and credit by a court of another state 8 9 to the extent required by federal law; and generally relating to protective orders and 10 peace orders.

1 2 3 4 5	(c) A law enforcement officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take into custody a person who the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of an order for protection that was issued by a court of another state or a Native American tribe and is in effect at the time of the violation if the person seeking the assistance of the law enforcement officer:
6 7	(1) has filed with the District Court or circuit court for the jurisdiction in which the person seeks assistance a copy of the order; or
8 9	(2) <u>displays or presents to the law enforcement officer a copy of the order that appears valid on its face.</u>
10 11 12	(d) A law enforcement officer acting in accordance with this section shall be immune from civil liability if the law enforcement officer acts in good faith and in a reasonable manner.
