## **Crimes – Theft of Scrap Metal**

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from knowingly and willfully taking the scrap metal of another without authorization; establishing certain penalties for a violation of this Act; requiring a certain person to pay the value of certain repairs or replacements; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the theft of scrap metal.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

# 17 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "SCRAP METAL" MEANS COPPER, COPPER 18 ALLOY, COPPER UTILITY WIRE, BRONZE, ALUMINUM, AND ANY OTHER NONFERROUS 19 METAL, ALLOY, OR OTHER MIXTURE.

20 (2) "SCRAP METAL" INCLUDES:

21(I)HOUSING FIXTURES SUCH AS DOWNSPOUTS, PIPES, WIRING,22OR FLASHING;

SHALL RESTORE THE SCRAP METAL TAKEN TO THE OWNER OR PAY THE OWNER THE VALUE OF THE SCRAP METAL. 1516 **(D)** IF THE THEFT OF SCRAP METAL CAUSES DAMAGE TO OR DESTROYS OTHER PROPERTY, A PERSON CONVICTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL PAY THE 17OWNER THE VALUE OF REPAIRS TO OR REPLACEMENT OF THE DAMAGED OR 18 19 **DESTROYED PROPERTY.** 

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 October 1, 2015.
