- FOR the purpose of authorizing a judge to award a reward to a person providing information leading to a conviction for a violation of certain nuisance organism laws or regulations; requiring a certain reward to be paid from certain fine proceeds in an amount not to exceed a certain percentage of fines imposed; prohibiting a reward from being awarded to a law enforcement officer or an employee of the Department of Natural Resources; and generally relating to nuisance organism laws and regulations.

1 (8) "Nuisance organism" means a nonnative aquatic organism that will 2 foreseeably alter and threaten to harm the ecosystem or the abundance and diversity of 3 native or naturalized fish and other organisms.

4 (i) (1) In addition to any other penalty provided under law, a person who 5 violates a provision of this section or a regulation adopted under this section is guilty of a 6 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or a fine 7 not exceeding \$2,500 or both for each offense, but not exceeding a total of \$25,000 for 8 offenses arising out of the same enforcement action.

9 (2) Each nuisance organism imported or possessed in violation of this 10 section or a regulation adopted under this section constitutes a separate offense.

11(3)(I)IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PARAGRAPH, ON CONVICTION12FOR A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SECTION, THE JUDGE MAY AWARD A REWARD TO A13PERSON PROVIDING INFORMATION LEADING TO THE CONVICTION.

14(II)A REWARD SHALL BE PAID FROM THE FINE PROCEEDS IN AN15AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ONE-HALF OF THE FINE IMPOSED ON CONVICTION.

16(III) A REWARD MAY NOT BE AWARDED TO A LAW ENFORCEMENT17OFFICER OR AN EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 October 1, 2015.
