CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Single Registration Plate – Class L (Historic) Vehicles and**
3 **Class N (Street Rod) Vehicles**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration, when it registers a Class
5 L (historic) vehicle or Class N (street rod) vehicle, to issue a single registration plate
6 for the vehicle; making conforming and stylistic changes; and generally relating to
7 vehicle registration plates.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 Annotated Code of Maryland

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Transportation**

16 13–410.

17 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, when it registers a vehicle,
18 the Administration shall issue to the owner:

1 (i) One registration plate, if the vehicle is a Class D (motorcycle)
2 vehicle, Class F (tractor) vehicle, [or] Class G (trailer) vehicle, **CLASS L (HISTORIC)**
3 **VEHICLE, OR CLASS N (STREET ROD) VEHICLE**; and

4 (ii) Two registration plates for every other vehicle.

5 (2) However, as to temporary registration, the Administration may provide
6 for the issuance of only one temporary registration plate for any vehicle.

8 (a) In this section, “vintage registration plate” means a Maryland registration
9 plate that was actually issued for display on a motor vehicle in a year not less than 25 years
10 prior to January 1 of each calendar year.

11 (b) [(1) Subject to the provisions of this subsection, the] **THE** owner of a motor
12 vehicle registered under § 13–936 or § 13–937.1 of this subtitle as a Class L (historic) or
13 Class N (street rod) vehicle may display [2] **TWO** vintage registration plates in lieu of A
14 current registration [plates] **PLATE** on that vehicle[.

15 (2) The Administration may authorize the display of 2 vintage registration
16 plates in lieu of current registration plates on a motor vehicle described in paragraph (1) of
17 this subsection] if:

18 [(i)] **(1)** The owner of the motor vehicle submits an application on
19 a form prescribed by the Administrator;

20 [(ii)] **(2)** The [2] **TWO** vintage registration plates were issued in the
21 same year as the model year of the motor vehicle; and

22 [(iii)] **(3)** The owner of the motor vehicle pays a onetime registration
23 fee of \$25.50.

24 (c) If the Administration authorizes the display of vintage registration plates
25 under this section:

26 (1) The vintage registration plates shall remain valid for as long as title to
27 the motor vehicle remains in the person who submitted an application under subsection
28 [(b)(2)(i)] **(B)(1)** of this section; and

29 (2) A fee in addition to the onetime registration fee prescribed in subsection
30 [(b)(2)(iii)] **(B)(3)** of this section is not required for the issuance of the vintage registration
31 plates.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
33 October 1, 2015.
