SENATE BILL 392

- 1 (c) (1) In this subsection, "physical injury" means any impairment of physical condition, excluding minor injuries.
- 3 (2) A person may not intentionally cause physical injury to another if the 4 person knows or has reason to know that the other is:
- 5 (i) a law enforcement officer engaged in the performance of the 6 officer's official duties; [or]
- 7 (ii) a parole or probation agent engaged in the performance of the 8 agent's official duties; \mathbf{OR}
- 9 (III) A FIREFIGHTER, AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN, A 10 RESCUE SQUAD MEMBER, OR ANY OTHER FIRST RESPONDER ENGAGED IN 11 PROVIDING EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE OR RESCUE SERVICES.
- 12 (3) A person who violates paragraph (2) of this subsection is guilty of the 13 felony of assault in the second degree and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not 14 exceeding [10] **15** years or a fine not exceeding \$5,000 or both.
