22 23	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease, a progressive neurodegenerative brain disorder, tragically robs individuals of their memories and leads to progressive mental and physical

- WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth-leading cause of death in the United States, the ninth-leading cause of death in Maryland, and is the only cause of death in the top ten that has no cure, no treatment, and no way to slow its progression; and
- WHEREAS, More than 5,000,000 people in the United States are living with Alzheimer's disease, including 97,000 Marylanders; and
- WHEREAS, The cost of caring for people with Alzheimer's disease in the United States exceeds \$200 billion per year, and those costs are expected to rise dramatically with the increase in the numbers of older people in the coming decades; and
- 9 WHEREAS, There are over 286,000 dedicated caregivers in Maryland who provide 10 unpaid care at home valued at more than \$4 billion; and
- WHEREAS, Medicare and most private health insurance do not cover the long-term services and support that most people with Alzheimer's disease and dementia need; and
- WHEREAS, According to the National Institute on Aging, Alzheimer's disease indirectly costs businesses up to \$37 billion a year in lost productivity for employees who miss work or leave their jobs to provide care for a relative; and
- WHEREAS, Researchers in Maryland and around the world continue their efforts to develop scientific breakthroughs that could one day bring about a world without Alzheimer's disease; and
- WHEREAS, There is a need to raise awareness about Alzheimer's disease and to honor all the caregivers who support and care for loved ones with Alzheimer's disease; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7–504 through 7–506, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–505 through 7–507, respectively.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - General Provisions

29 **7–504.**

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- 30 (A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM JUNE AS ALZHEIMER'S 31 AND BRAIN AWARENESS MONTH IN RECOGNITION OF ALL MARYLANDERS, 32 INCLUDING FAMILY CAREGIVERS, WHO HAVE BEEN TOUCHED BY ALZHEIMER'S
- 33 DISEASE AND OTHER BRAIN-RELATED DISEASES.

- 1 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND 2 MENTAL HYGIENE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING, IN CONJUNCTION WITH 3 RELATED PUBLIC HEALTH AND ADVOCACY ENTITIES, TO OBSERVE ALZHEIMER'S AND BRAIN AWARENESS MONTH PROPERLY WITH APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, 5 CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING:
- 6 (1) CAREGIVER SUMMITS IN HONOR OF THE LONGEST DAY TEAM
 7 EVENT TO PROVIDE PUBLIC INPUT REGARDING CAREGIVING NEEDS, CHALLENGES,
 8 AND BARRIERS; AND
- 9 (2) AS APPROPRIATE, UPDATES FROM THE VIRGINIA I. JONES 10 ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED DISORDERS COUNCIL.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
