- FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor annually to proclaim a certain month as Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month and to urge the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Department of Aging, in conjunction with certain entities, to properly observe Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities, including certain summits and updates; and generally relating to Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month.

2 3 4	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease, a progressive neurodegenerative brain disorder tragically robs individuals of their memories and leads to progressive mental and physical impairments; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the sixth-leading cause of death in the United States, the ninth-leading cause of death in Maryland, and is the only cause of death in the top ten that has no cure, no treatment, and no way to slow its progression; and
8 9	WHEREAS, More than 5,000,000 people in the United States are living with Alzheimer's disease, including 97,000 Marylanders; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, The cost of caring for people with Alzheimer's disease in the United States exceeds \$200 billion per year, and those costs are expected to rise dramatically with the increase in the numbers of older people in the coming decades; and
13 14	WHEREAS, There are over 286,000 dedicated caregivers in Maryland who provide unpaid care at home valued at more than \$4 billion; and
15 16	WHEREAS, Medicare and most private health insurance do not cover the long-term services and support that most people with Alzheimer's disease and dementia need; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, According to the National Institute on Aging, Alzheimer's disease indirectly costs businesses up to \$37 billion a year in lost productivity for employees who miss work or leave their jobs to provide care for a relative; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, Researchers in Maryland and around the world continue their efforts to develop scientific breakthroughs that could one day bring about a world without Alzheimer's disease; and
23 24 25	WHEREAS, There is a need to raise awareness about Alzheimer's disease and to honor all the caregivers who support and care for loved ones with Alzheimer's disease; now, therefore,
