# Anne Arundel County Board of Education – Public School Holidays – References in Official Publications (Public School Holiday Protection Act)

#### 5 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the proper name of certain official school holidays from 6 being removed, renamed, or prohibited from being referenced in any official 7 publication of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education or public school under 8 the jurisdiction of the board; and generally relating to references to public school 9 holidays in official publications of the Anne Arundel County Board of Education or 10 public schools under the jurisdiction of the board.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

1 (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (e), and (f) of this section, each public 2 school under the jurisdiction of a county board:

3 (1) (i) Shall be open for pupil attendance for at least 180 actual school 4 days and a minimum of 1,080 school hours during a 10-month period in each school year; 5 or

6 (ii) If normal school attendance is prevented because of conditions 7 described in subsection (b) of this section, shall be open for at least 1,080 hours during a 8 10-month period;

9 (2) Shall be open for pupil attendance a minimum of 3 hours during each 10 school day; and

11 (3) May not be open on Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays in order to meet 12 the 180-day or 1,080-hour requirement of this subsection.

13 (b) (1) If a county board submits a written application to the State Board that 14 describes a demonstrated effort by the county board to comply with subsection (a) of this 15 section, the State Board may permit:

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(i) Adjustments in the length of the school year;

17 (ii) Exceptions from the requirement that the school year be 18 completed within a 10-month period;

19 (iii) Adjustments in the length of the school day; and

20 (iv) Schools to be open on holidays.

21 (2) These adjustments may be granted only if normal school attendance is 22 prevented because of:

- 23 (i) Natural disaster;
- 24 (ii) Civil disaster; or
- 25 (iii) Severe weather conditions.

26 (3) Education funding from State or local sources may not be reduced if 27 there are less than 180 school days in any year because of an approved application under 28 this subsection.

29 (4) In case of emergency, the State Board may open schools on holidays.

30 (c) (1) The following days are public school holidays:

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1		(i)	Thanksgiving Day and the day after;
2		(ii)	Christmas Eve and from then through January 1;
3		(iii)	Martin Luther King, Jr. Day;
4		(iv)	Presidents' Day;

2 (d) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, the State Board shall 3 divide the school year into the terms it considers appropriate.

4 (e) (1) The county boards of Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Howard, 5 Montgomery, and Prince George's counties, and the Board of School Commissioners of 6 Baltimore City, may elect to operate one or more schools within the county or Baltimore 7 City on a year-round basis, provided that the 180-day and the minimum hour 8 requirements under this section are met.

9 (2) Nothing in this section precludes a county board from conducting a 10 year-round pilot study or program that is funded by the county board.

11 (f) Publicly funded prekindergarten programs are not subject to the 12 requirements of subsection (a) of this section.

14 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY.

15 (B) THE PROPER NAME OF AN OFFICIAL SCHOOL HOLIDAY LISTED IN § 16 7–103 OF THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT BE REMOVED, RENAMED, OR PROHIBITED FROM 17 BEING REFERENCED IN ANY OFFICIAL PUBLICATION, INCLUDING ON A SCHOOL 18 CALENDAR, OF THE ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION OR PUBLIC 19 SCHOOL UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 21 1, 2015.

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
