AN ACT concerning 1

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2 Workgroup to Study Safe Harbor Policy for Youth Victims of Human Trafficking

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Workgroup to Study Safe Harbor Policy for Youth 4 Victims of Human Trafficking; specifying the purpose of the Workgroup; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; establishing the duties of the Workgroup; requiring the Workgroup to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Study Safe Harbor Policy for Youth Victims of Human Trafficking.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That: 13
- There is a Workgroup to Study Safe Harbor Policy for Youth Victims of Human 14 (a) Trafficking. 15
- 16 The purpose of the Workgroup is to study: (b)
 - (1) legal protections for youth victims of human trafficking; and
- 18 (2)the provision of services for youth victims of human trafficking.

(h) On or before December 1, 2015, the Workgroup shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with \S 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2016, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
