## Blind or Visually Impaired Children – Individualized Education Programs – Orientation and Mobility Instruction

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain individualized education programs for certain blind 5 or visually impaired children to include certain orientation and mobility instruction 6 under certain circumstances; requiring certain orientation and mobility evaluations 7 to be provided under certain circumstances; requiring a certain orientation and 8 mobility evaluation to contain certain content; requiring certain local school systems 9 to provide certain parents and guardians with a certain verbal and written notice at a certain time; requiring certain orientation and mobility instruction to be provided 10 11 by a certain qualified individual; requiring the State Department of Education to 12 adopt certain regulations and provide certain guidelines on or before certain dates; 13 defining certain terms; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to 14 orientation and mobility instruction in individualized education programs for blind 15 or visually impaired children.

1 "Child who is blind or visually impaired" means a child who: (2) 2 Has a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with 3 correcting lenses or has a limited field of vision so that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees; 4 5 (ii) Has a medically indicated expectation of visual deterioration; or 6 Has a medically diagnosed limitation in visual functioning that 7 restricts the child's ability to read and write standard print at levels expected of other children of comparable ability and grade level. 8 9 "Braille" means the system of reading and writing through touch commonly known as Standard English Contracted Braille. 10 "Individualized education program" and "IEP team" have the same 11 12 meaning as provided by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. 13 "National Instructional Materials Access Center" means the center established under § 674(e) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education 14 15 Improvement Act of 2004. 16 "NIMAS" means the National Instructional Materials Accessibility 17 Standard established by the federal Secretary for Education under 20 U.S.C. 1412 to be 18 used in the preparation of electronic files suitable and used solely for efficient conversion into specialized formats. 19 20 "ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY" MEANS INSTRUCTION PROVIDED **(7)** 21TO A CHILD WHO IS BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED TO ENABLE THE CHILD TO ATTAIN 22 SYSTEMATIC ORIENTATION TO AND SAFE MOVEMENT WITHIN THE CHILD'S SCHOOL, 23HOME, AND COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENTS. 24"Print instructional materials" means printed textbooks and 25related printed core materials that are written and published primarily for use in 26 elementary school and secondary school instruction and are required by the Department or 27 county board for use by students in the classroom. 28 "Specialized formats" means braille, large print, audio, or digital [(8)] **(9)** 29 text that is used by blind or visually impaired individuals. 30 (b) In developing the individualized education program for a child who is (1)31 blind or visually impaired, provisions shall be made for instruction in braille and the use of 32 braille unless the IEP team determines, after an evaluation of the child's reading and writing skills, needs, and appropriate reading and writing media, including an evaluation 33

of the child's future needs for instruction in braille or the use of braille, that such

instruction or use is not appropriate for the child.
