CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Washington County - Liquor Tasting License

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a special liquor tasting license to be issued in Washington 4 County; authorizing the license to be issued only to a holder of Class A (off-sale) 5 beer, wine and liquor license; establishing the annual license fee; authorizing the 6 Board of License Commissioners for Washington County to issue the license for 7 certain purposes; prohibiting the holder of the license from charging for the liquor 8 tasting or sampling; providing for the number of days in a licensing year that the 9 license is effective; requiring the licensee to notify the Board in writing a certain 10 number of days in advance of a scheduled tasting date; prohibiting a licensee from 11 holding more than one liquor, beer, or wine tasting event on the same day; limiting 12 the number of bottles that may be open at any one time during the tasting event; 13 prohibiting the contents of certain bottles from being mixed; requiring certain bottles 14 to be destroyed; limiting the number of servings for each customer; requiring the 15 Board to adopt regulations; defining a certain term; and generally relating to a 16 special liquor tasting license in Washington County.

- 3 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "BOARD" MEANS THE BOARD OF LICENSE 4 COMMISSIONERS FOR WASHINGTON COUNTY.
- 5 (B) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN WASHINGTON COUNTY.
- 6 (C) AN APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL LIQUOR TASTING LICENSE (LTL) 7 SHALL BE MADE ON A FORM THAT THE BOARD PROVIDES.
- 8 (D) A SPECIAL LIQUOR TASTING LICENSE (LTL) MAY BE ISSUED ONLY TO A 9 HOLDER OF A CLASS A (OFF-SALE) BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE.
- 10 (E) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$300 FOR 12 TASTINGS AND \$500 FOR 24 11 TASTINGS.
- 12 **(F)** THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A SPECIAL LIQUOR TASTING LICENSE (LTL) TO 13 PERMIT ON–PREMISES CONSUMPTION OF LIQUOR FOR TASTING OR SAMPLING
- 14 PURPOSES ONLY.
- 15 (G) THE HOLDER OF A SPECIAL LIQUOR TASTING LICENSE MAY NOT CHARGE 16 FOR THE LIQUOR TASTING OR SAMPLING.
- 17 (H) (1) THE LICENSE IS EFFECTIVE FOR USE NO MORE THAN 12 DAYS IN
- 18 A LICENSING YEAR FOR A 12-TASTING LICENSE AND 24 DAYS IN A LICENSING YEAR
- 19 FOR A 24-TASTING LICENSE.
- 20 (2) THE LICENSEE SHALL NOTIFY THE BOARD IN WRITING AT LEAST 10 DAYS IN ADVANCE OF ANY SCHEDULED TASTING DATE.
- 22 (3) A LICENSEE MAY NOT HOLD MORE THAN ONE LIQUOR, BEER, OR 23 WINE TASTING EVENT ON THE SAME DAY.
- 24 (I) (1) A MAXIMUM OF FOUR BOTTLES MAY BE OPEN AT ANY ONE TIME AT 25 A LIQUOR TASTING EVENT.
- 26 (2) THE CONTENTS OF EACH BOTTLE MAY NOT BE MIXED WITH ANY OTHER BOTTLE, AND ALL BOTTLES SHALL BE DESTROYED ONCE THEY ARE EMPTY.
- 28 (J) SERVINGS ARE LIMITED TO NO MORE THAN ONE-HALF OUNCE OF ANY 29 ONE LIQUOR TO ANY ONE CUSTOMER AND ONLY FOUR SAMPLES PER CUSTOMER.
