## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 State Finance and Procurement – One Maryland Blue Ribbon Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the One Maryland Blue Ribbon Commission; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Commission from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the 6 reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Commission to review the current 7 State procurement process and develop policy recommendations to ensure 8 transparency and greater participation of businesses located in the State in State 9 contracting; requiring the Commission to report its findings and recommendations 10 to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the 11 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the One Maryland Blue Ribbon 12 Commission.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That:

- 15 (a) There is a One Maryland Blue Ribbon Commission.
- 16 (b) The Commission consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of18 the Senate;
- 19 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 20 the House of Delegates; and

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A member of the Commission: 1 (e)  $\mathbf{2}$ (1)may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but 3 (2)is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (f) The Commission shall: 6 review the advantages and disadvantages for businesses located in the (1)7 State with regard to the current State procurement process; 8 (2)review current State incentives for businesses located in the State to 9 participate in State contracts; 10 (3)review geographic partnerships to determine whether State agencies 11 are contracting with businesses located in the State; and 12develop policy recommendations on how the State can improve the (4)13procurement process to ensure transparency and greater participation of businesses located 14in the State in State contracting. On or before December 31, 2015, the Commission shall report its findings and 15(g)16recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 17Government Article, the General Assembly. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 18 1, 2015. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2016, 19 20with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and 21of no further force and effect.
