2	Department of Health and Mental Hygiene - Workgroup to Evaluate Mental

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to convene a workgroup to evaluate and make findings and recommendations regarding the state of mental health care delivery on the Eastern Shore of Maryland; requiring the workgroup to include certain individuals; requiring the Department to report the findings and recommendations of the workgroup in a certain manner to certain legislative committees on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the Workgroup to Evaluate Mental Health Care Delivery on the Eastern Shore.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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- 13 (a) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall convene a workgroup to 14 evaluate the state of mental health care delivery on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, 15 including:

- 18 (2) the adequacy of the mental health care workforce;
- 19 (3) the impact the closure of the Upper Shore Community Mental Health 20 Center has had on access to mental health services and drug treatment in communities in 21 the former service area of the Center;
- 22 (4) the feasibility of reopening the Upper Shore Community Mental Health 23 Center, including:
- 24 (i) the cost of reopening the Center;
