FOR the purpose of authorizing the governing body of Baltimore County to grant a credit 4 $\mathbf{5}$ against the county property tax for certain owner-occupied residential real property 6 within a certain proximity to a certain refuse disposal system under certain 7 conditions; prohibiting the governing body of Baltimore County from granting a 8 credit for taxable years beginning after a certain date; defining a certain term; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to a property tax 9 credit for certain residential real property in proximity to a certain refuse disposal 10 system in Baltimore County. 11

 1, 2015, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 2015.
