3 FOR the purpose of altering the penalty for certain violations of the prevailing wage rate 4 law related to the posting of certain statements of prevailing wage rates: altering the amount of certain liquidated damages for which a certain contractor is liable for  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 certain violations of the prevailing wage rate law related to payroll records; altering 7 the circumstances under which a certain contractor is liable for certain damages and 8 the amount of certain liquidated damages for which a certain contractor is liable 9 when certain laborers or certain other employees are paid less than certain 10 prevailing wage rates; and generally relating to the enforcement of the prevailing 11 wage rate law.

27	liquidated damages of [\$20] <b>\$250</b> for each laborer or other employee for each day for which
28	THE CONTRACTOR KNOWINGLY PAYS:

30	while THE LABORER IS performing a task required to be performed by a mechanic or

2 (b) (1) If a contractor or subcontractor pays an employee less than the amount 3 the employee is entitled to receive for the work performed, the contractor shall make 4 restitution to the employee.

5 (2) The contractor and the subcontractor shall be jointly and severally 6 liable for restitution to the subcontractor's employees.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2015.
