Frederick County - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing in Frederick County a Class B-CC (conference center) 4 license, a Class BLX (luxury restaurant) B license, and a Class MEC 5 (micro-brewery/entertainment center) license; specifying certain requirements for 6 the licensed establishments; specifying the types of alcoholic beverages that may be 7 sold for on-premises consumption in certain locations at the licensed establishments; 8 providing for the hours of sale and license fees; requiring that the Board of License 9 Commissioners define a certain term; authorizing the Board of License 10 Commissioners to issue a Class MEC license to a person for a certain use; providing 11 that the entertainment center for which a Class MEC license is issued may contain 12 or allow certain features; providing an exception to a prohibition against the issuance 13 of a license in a certain election district; providing an exception to a prohibition 14 against the issuance of more than one license being issued to one person or for one 15 premises; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Frederick County.
