Health and Government Operations

General Provisions - Commemorative Days - Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day

This emergency bill designates March 30 as Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day in recognition of the service and sacrifice of Vietnam veterans.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Commemorating Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day does not affect governmental finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Twelve official commemorative days and six months are recognized in State law as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3:00 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Background: As noted in the preamble, the Vietnam War was fought in Vietnam from 1961 to 1975, and involved North Vietnam and the Viet Cong in conflict with the U.S. Armed Forces, allies of the United States, and South Vietnam. In 1965, more than 129,000 members of the U.S. Armed Forces were serving in Vietnam, reaching a peak of approximately 543,000 by 1969. On January 27, 1973, an agreement was reached to end

the war and, on March 30, 1973, the U.S. Armed Forces completed its withdrawal of combat troops.

More than 58,000 members of the U.S. Armed Forces, including 1,014 from Maryland, lost their lives in Vietnam and more than 300,000 members were wounded. Vietnam veterans were caught on their return home in the crossfire of an extremely divisive public SB 80/ Page 2

debate about the involvement of the United States in the Vietnam War, which deprived many of those veterans of public support and appreciation of their patriotic service.

The U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives have both passed resolutions expressing support to establish a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day." In 2009, California enacted legislation declaring March 30 as "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day."
