10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)							

Founded in 1973, the Jewish Council for the Aging (JCA) helps older people in the National Capital Region to remain in life's mainstream for as long and as independently as possible by developing and running programs that ensure dignity, self-determination, and independent lifestyles for all seniors regardless of faiths, ethnicity or income level. JCA accomplishes its work through a myriad of community-based programs built upon vibrant programmatic partnerships with funders, fellow charities and local communities; and by providing opportunities for volunteers to make the region a great place to age. The philanthropy served more than 31,000 older adults and family caregivers during the fiscal year ending June, 30, 2014.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Bronfman Center at 12320 Parklawn Drive in Rockville houses 19 local charities - the Jewish Council for the Aging and The Nonprofit Village and its tenants. More than 100 people work at the Bronfman Center, and weekly, we welcome approximately 550 guests, including 38 Kensington Club members, 32 SeniorTech students, 125 participants in our senior employment programs and 350 meeting attendees. We seek to improve the front entrance and outdoor patio area so its better accessible for clients, volunteers and others with special needs; and to improve the safety and utility of the parking lot by repaving the steep parking lot to reduce falls, avoid potholes and better delineate entrance and exit paths. On the Bronfman Center's Terrace Level, we hope to better serve the elderly clients of JCA's Kensington Club by replacing the carpet with a solid surface flooring that can endure frequent food spills and possible bladder incontinence incidents. At the Misler Adult Day Center located at 1801 East Jefferson Street in Rockville, we serve vulnerable seniors who are ill, frail and/or cognitively impaired. The Misler Center served 111 participants in Fiscal Year 2014. We seek to upgrade the damaged flooring, counters and cabinets, enlarge the activity room, create a no-threshold ADA shower and upgrade the outdoor area so that it can be safely used by those with dementia.

The capital grant approved during the legislative session of 2008 helped JCA to acquire and partially renovate the building now known as the Ann L. Bronfman Center. The requested grant would provide half of the funds needed for improvements not provided under the previous award. Capital grant from legislative session of 2014 is being used strictly for HVAC replacement and energy efficiency improvements.
In kind contributions of approximately \$11,000 covered the cost of the safety and accessibility improvement plan described above.
