Opportunity Action Council was organized as a Community Action Agency under the Economic Opportunity Act in 1965. Beginning in 1965, CAC has been one of the 1,200 Community Action Agencies funded nationwide through the Community Action Program. The mission of the agency is to provide programs and services to low-income residents of Howard County in order to alleviate the effects of poverty; to promote self-sufficiency as a means of interrupting the cycle of poverty; and to stimulate increased awareness of, and responsiveness to, the needs of the lowincome population on the part of the larger community.

CAC provides a comprehensive range of services for low-income residents of Howard County; these include homelessness prevention, emergency and supplemental food assistance, energy assistance, Weatherization, Head Start, including the First Presbyterian Center, crisis intervention, and a Summer Youth Employment Program.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The CAC Food Bank is the largest hunger relief nonprofit in Howard County. CAC has operated the Howard County Food Bank since its inception during the County Executive Hugh Nichols administration in the early 1980s. Since its beginnings, the Food Bank has either been housed in a county owned facility or its rent has been supported by a grant from the County government. Since 2008, our distribution has increased by 480 percent. CAC also supports a network of 13 food pantries across the county. In FY 2013, the Food Bank distributed more than 470,000 pounds of food to approximately 23,000 individuals. We anticipate distribution of 500,000 pounds of food in fiscal year 2014.

As a partner with the State and the United Way of Central Maryland to end hunger, we need to address infrastructure and capacity needs that support us in our efforts to keep pace with the increased demand.

At the present time, CAC leases a space that is not sufficient to meet its current needs. The funds allocated for rental can be used smarter and be re-purposed as a long-term investment in a site that *Round all amounts to the nearest \$1,000.
