10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)								

Catholic Charities is the social ministry outreach of the Archdiocese of Washington. Motivated by the Gospel message of Jesus Christ, and guided by Catholic social and moral teaching, Catholic Charities strengthens the lives of all in need by giving help that empowers and hope that lasts. To this end we affirm and support the dignity of all human life, strengthen families and serve the poor and most vulnerable.

Since the 1930s, Catholic Charities has helped those who are hungry, homeless, troubled and vulnerable in and around our Nations Capital. Every day, thousands of children, adults and families from all walks of life turn to one of our five departments operating 65 programs in 47 locations across the District of Columbia and the surrounding Maryland counties of Montgomery, Prince Georges, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys. Today, Catholic Charities impact is vast, with a budget of \$71 million, a staff of 800 employees, and a network of 8,700 volunteers who strengthen the lives of more than 120,000 of our neighbors, regardless of background, belief, or circumstance.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Catholic Charities Susan D Mona Center will be a family services center serving the materially poor in Prince Georges County. The three primary services that will be offered will be:

- * Feeding and Nutrition Catholic Charities currently operates a number of food programs across the Archdiocese and we are considering programs including a teaching kitchen that will train people in the culinary arts, nutrition and healthy cooking classes, a food pantry and farmers market.
- * Healthcare Building on our successful operation of two clinics in Washington, DC and Wheaton, MD, we hope to offer a six-chair dental clinic with a full range of oral health services, from preventive cleanings to extractions, root canals, and other complex restorative care.
- * Legal The Catholic Charities Legal Network and Immigration Legal Services programs offer representation, education, and workshops on a number of legal issues that could benefit the local community. Workshops could include tenant / landlord disputes, wills and estates, domestic violence matters (i.e. child support and restraining orders). immigration, expungement, and other Round all amounts to the nearest \$1,000. 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)
Initial planning, including staff projections and operating costs presented above, reflects services Catholic Charities already offers in other locations that will be relocated to the site as well as our projected staffing for a new dental clinic and two staff members who will coordinate building operations (front desk/receptionist and office/building manager). As additional operating funding becomes available, at least ten additional staff members, some of whom may be part-time, are projected to enhance service offerings, and initial designs are being drawn forecasting that future operational growth.
The number of projected staff members reported is estimated based upon paid Catholic Charities positions only. Programs providing services at the site will actively use a number of volunteers. Catholic Charities plans to reserve space to share with partner organizations, including Prince George's County staff members and staff and volunteers from private organizations who offer services that will aid the people we intend to serve. These additional service providers will also benefit from the renovations.
