Ways and Means

Election Law - Counting of Properly Cast Ballots

This bill requires that a ballot properly cast by a voter who dies before the ballot is canvassed be counted in full unless a law or regulation requires that the ballot be fully or partially rejected for a reason unrelated to the death of the voter.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2015.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not directly affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: Pursuant to State law, a local board of elections must reject an absentee ballot if, before the ballot is canvassed, the board determines that the voter died before election day. In contrast with that requirement, a vote cast during early voting (a method of voting more recently added to State law) is counted regardless of whether the voter dies before election day.
