## 2 Firearms – Digital Fingerprint Record – Permit Renewal

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of State Police to take and maintain a set of digital fingerprints for each applicant for a permit to carry, wear, or transport a handgun; specifying that a person who applies for the renewal of a handgun permit is not required to provide a set of fingerprints unless the Secretary expressly determines that an applicant must provide a new set of fingerprints to resolve a question of that applicant's identity; and generally relating to firearms.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 21 Article – Public Safety

- 23 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

- 1 (d) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Secretary to carry, wear, or transport 2 a handgun.
- 3 5–305.
- 4 (c) (1) As part of the application for a criminal history records check, the 5 Secretary shall submit to the Central Repository:
- [(1)] (I) two complete sets of the applicant's legible fingerprints taken on forms approved by the Director of the Central Repository and the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- 9 **[**(2)**] (II)** the fee authorized under § 10–221(b)(7) of the Criminal 10 Procedure Article for access to Maryland criminal history records; and
- [(3)] (III) the mandatory processing fee required by the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history records check.
- 13 (2) THE SECRETARY SHALL TAKE AND MAINTAIN A SET OF DIGITAL FINGERPRINTS FOR EACH APPLICANT DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

- 17 (a) A permit expires on the last day of the holder's birth month following 2 years 18 after the date the permit is issued.
- 19 (b) A permit may be renewed for successive periods of 3 years each if, at the time 20 of an application for renewal, the applicant possesses the qualifications for the issuance of 21 a permit and pays the renewal fee stated in this subtitle.
- (C) A PERSON WHO APPLIES FOR A RENEWAL OF A PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A SET OF FINGERPRINTS BEYOND THE DIGITAL FINGERPRINTS REQUIRED IN § 5–305(C) OF THIS SUBTITLE UNLESS THE SECRETARY EXPRESSLY DETERMINES THAT AN APPLICANT MUST PROVIDE A NEW SET OF FINGERPRINTS TO RESOLVE A QUESTION OF THAT APPLICANT'S IDENTITY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
