A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Maryland Education Opportunity Act of 2016

3 FOR the purpose of exempting certain individuals from payment of tuition to attend a 4 community college in the State under certain circumstances; providing a certain 5 discount on tuition to certain individuals attending a community college in the State 6 under certain circumstances; requiring certain individuals to apply for certain 7 financial aid; providing for the duration of the tuition waiver and the tuition 8 discount; requiring certain individuals to be counted in a certain computation of 9 State and local aid to community colleges; specifying how financial aid shall be 10 applied for individuals who receive a tuition waiver or a tuition discount; requiring 11 the State to reimburse community colleges for certain foregone tuition revenue; 12 requiring that funds used to reimburse community colleges shall be paid from the 13 Education Trust Fund from funds allocated from a certain source; authorizing the 14 Maryland Higher Education Commission to adopt certain regulations; defining a 15 certain term; and generally relating to a tuition waiver and a tuition discount for 16 certain individuals at community colleges in the State.

- 1 (2) THE TUITION WAIVER OR THE TUITION DISCOUNT SHALL APPLY
 2 TO THE DIFFERENCE, IF ANY, BETWEEN THE CHARGE FOR TUITION AND THE
 3 FINANCIAL AID AWARD, NOT INCLUDING A STUDENT LOAN, THAT THE INDIVIDUAL
- 4 RECEIVES.
- 5 (3) ON REQUEST, THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL ASSIST ANY 6 INDIVIDUAL REQUIRED TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR STATE OR FEDERAL 7 STUDENT FINANCIAL AID UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 8 (F) (1) A COMMUNITY COLLEGE IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FROM
 9 THE STATE FOR FOREGONE TUITION REVENUE RESULTING FROM TUITION WAIVERS
 10 AND TUITION DISCOUNTS AWARDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.
- 11 (2) ANY FUNDS USED TO REIMBURSE A COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR
 12 FOREGONE TUITION REVENUE SHALL BE PAID FROM THE EDUCATION TRUST FUND
 13 FROM THE FUNDS ALLOCATED UNDER § 9–1A–27 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT
 14 ARTICLE.
- 15 (G) THE COMMISSION MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO 16 IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

- 19 (a) There is an Education Trust Fund which is a special, nonlapsing fund that is 20 not subject to § 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 21 (b) (1) There shall be credited to the Education Trust Fund all proceeds 22 allocated to the Fund under § 9–1A–27 of this subtitle.
- 23 (2) Money in the Education Trust Fund shall be invested and reinvested by the Treasurer, and interest and earnings shall accrue to the Fund.
- 25 (c) Money in the Education Trust Fund shall be used to:
- 26 (1) provide funding for public elementary and secondary education, 27 through continuation of the funding and formulas established under the programs 28 commonly known as the Bridge to Excellence in Public Schools Act, first enacted by Chapter 29 288 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002, including the funding for regional 30 differences in the cost of education under § 5–202(f) of the Education Article;

- 1 (2) provide funds to construct public school buildings and provide public 2 school capital improvements in accordance with §§ 5–301 through 5–303 of the Education 3 Article;
- 4 (3) provide funds for capital projects at community colleges and public senior higher education institutions; [and]
- 6 (4) provide funds to expand public early childhood education programs in 7 the State; AND
- 8 (5) PROVIDE FUNDS TO REIMBURSE COMMUNITY COLLEGES FOR 9 FOREGONE TUITION REVENUE IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 16–106.1 OF THE 10 EDUCATION ARTICLE.
- 11 (d) Expenditures from the Education Trust Fund shall be made each fiscal year 12 in accordance with the State budget.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
