1 AN ACT concerning

Natural Resources – Fishing – Regulation and Use of Commercial Finfish Trotlines

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of Natural Resources, in consultation with
certain entities, to adopt regulations defining and governing the use of commercial
finfish trotlines; establishing an exception to the prohibition against using more than
a certain number of hooks or sets of hooks for each commercial rod or line by
authorizing a tidal fish licensee to use a finfish trotline; and generally relating to the
regulation and use of commercial finfish trotlines.
