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Medical Cannabis - Written Certifications - Certifying Providers

- FOR the purpose of authorizing certain dentists, podiatrists, nurse midwives, and nurse practitioners, in addition to physicians, to issue written certifications to qualifying patients by substituting the defined term "certifying provider" for "certifying physician" as it relates to laws governing medical cannabis; making conforming changes; making a stylistic change; and generally relating to providers authorized to provide written certifications for medical cannabis.

IS IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE STATE BOARD OF 23 NURSING; 24[(3)] **(2)** Has a State controlled dangerous substances registration; and [(4)] (3) 25 Is registered with the Commission to make cannabis available to patients for medical use in accordance with regulations adopted by the Commission. 26 27 "Qualifying patient" means an individual who: (m) Has been provided with a written certification by a certifying 28 29 [physician] **PROVIDER** in accordance with a bona fide [physician-patient]

If under the age of 18 years, has a caregiver.

- "Written certification" means a certification that: 1 (n) 2 Is issued by a certifying [physician] **PROVIDER** to a qualifying patient [physician] PROVIDER has a bona fide [physician-patient] 3 with whom the PROVIDER-PATIENT relationship; and 4 5 Includes a written statement certifying that, in the [physician's] (2)6 **PROVIDER'S** professional opinion, after having completed an assessment of the patient's 7 medical history and current medical condition, the patient has a condition: 8 That meets the inclusion criteria and does not meet the exclusion (i) 9 criteria of the certifying [physician's] PROVIDER'S application; and 10 For which the potential benefits of the medical use of cannabis (ii) 11 would likely outweigh the health risks for the patient; and 12 May include a written statement certifying that, in the [physician's] (3)PROVIDER'S professional opinion, a 30-day supply of medical cannabis would be 13 inadequate to meet the medical needs of the qualifying patient. 14 15 13–3304. 16 (a) The Commission shall register as a certifying [physician] PROVIDER an 17 individual who: 18 (1) Meets the requirements of this subtitle; and 19 (2)Submits application materials that meet the requirements of this subtitle. 20 21To be registered as a certifying [physician] PROVIDER, a [physician] 22 **PROVIDER** shall submit a proposal to the Commission that includes: 23(1) The reasons for including a patient under the care of the [physician] 24PROVIDER for the purposes of this subtitle, including the patient's qualifying medical 25conditions: 26 (2)An attestation that a standard patient evaluation will be completed, 27 including a history, a physical examination, a review of symptoms, and other pertinent
- 29 (3) The [physician's] **PROVIDER'S** plan for the ongoing assessment and follow—up care of a patient and for collecting and analyzing data.



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- 1 The Commission may not require an individual to meet requirements in 2 addition to the requirements listed in subsections (a) and (b) of this section to be registered 3 as a certifying [physician] PROVIDER. 4 (d) The Commission is encouraged to approve [physician] PROVIDER applications for the following medical conditions: 5 6 A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition that results 7 in a patient being admitted into hospice or receiving palliative care; or 8 A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition or the 9 treatment of a chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition that produces: 10 1. Cachexia, anorexia, or wasting syndrome; 11 2. Severe or chronic pain; 12 3. Severe nausea; 13 4. Seizures: or 14 5.
