1 AN ACT concerning

2 Business Regulation - Sales of Dogs and Cats - Required Health Certificate

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a certain person who sells a dog or cat to provide the 4 purchaser with a health certificate issued by a certain veterinarian within a certain 5 period of time; requiring a certain person who sells a dog or cat to disclose certain 6 health information about the dog or cat to a purchaser at a certain time; establishing 7 a certain penalty for a violation of this Act; providing that a person may bring an 8 action for damages incurred as a result of a violation of this Act; authorizing a court 9 to award attorney's fees under certain circumstances; and generally relating to a 10 required health certificate for the sale of dogs and cats.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 SUBTITLE 9. HEALTH CERTIFICATION OF DOGS AND CATS FOR SALE.
- 21 **19–901.**
- 22 THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO:

- 1 (1) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION ESTABLISHED TO PROMOTE ANIMAL
- 2 WELFARE THAT HAS RECEIVED TAX EXEMPT STATUS UNDER § 501(C)(3) OF THE U.S.
- 3 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE AND IS REGISTERED TO DO BUSINESS IN THE STATE;
- 4 (2) AN ANIMAL SHELTER OPERATED BY A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY;
- 5 OR
- 6 (3) A FOR-PROFIT RETAIL PET STORE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC THAT
- 7 SELLS OR OFFERS FOR SALE DOMESTIC ANIMALS TO BE KEPT AS HOUSEHOLD PETS.

- 9 (A) A PERSON WHO SELLS A DOG OR CAT SHALL PROVIDE TO THE
- 10 PURCHASER AT THE TIME OF THE SALE A HEALTH CERTIFICATE FROM A
- 11 VETERINARIAN LICENSED IN THE STATE ISSUED NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS BEFORE
- 12 THE DATE OF SALE.
- 13 (B) A PERSON WHO SELLS A DOG OR CAT AND WHO KNOWS OR SHOULD HAVE
- 14 KNOWN OF ANY ILLNESS, DISEASE, OR CONGENITAL OR HEREDITARY CONDITION OF
- 15 THE DOG OR CAT SHALL DISCLOSE THAT INFORMATION TO THE PURCHASER AT THE
- 16 TIME OF SALE.
- 17 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 18 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000.

- 20 (A) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER ACTION OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED BY LAW,
- 21 A PERSON MAY BRING AN ACTION FOR DAMAGES INCURRED AS THE RESULT OF A
- 22 VIOLATION OF § 19–902 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 23 (B) A PERSON WHO BRINGS AN ACTION UNDER THIS SECTION AND WHO IS
- 24 AWARDED DAMAGES MAY ALSO SEEK, AND THE COURT MAY AWARD, REASONABLE
- 25 ATTORNEY'S FEES.
- 26 (C) IF A COURT FINDS THAT AN ACTION UNDER THIS SECTION WAS
- 27 BROUGHT IN BAD FAITH OR WITHOUT SUBSTANTIAL JUSTIFICATION, THE COURT
- 28 MAY AWARD THE DEFENDANT REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES.
- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 October 1, 2016.
