A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2007, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion, 6 Two Million, Three Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,002,385,000), the 7 proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, 8 planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of 9 the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to 10 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and 11 improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that certain matching funds 12be provided and expended by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and 13sale of bonds evidencing the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt in certain 14years to be used for certain purposes; imposing a certain tax on all assessable 15property in the State; requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements 16under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the 17proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date; 18 authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain circumstances, to approve 19certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical differences; authorizing 20certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans 21 to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain 22programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the 23authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be 24reduced by certain amounts; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain 25locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; requiring the 26Comptroller to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; repealing 27certain Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization acts; making 28certain technical corrections; providing for a delayed effective date for certain 29provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital 30 projects.

7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 8 That:

9 (1)The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on 10 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland 11 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2016 in the total principal amount of \$1,002,385,000. 12This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and 13 14delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 8-131.2 of the State Finance and 15Procurement Article.

16 (2)The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a 17single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

18 (3)The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and 19 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the 20bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on 21the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for 22the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
