- 16 (a) This section applies to a flag of the United States or of this State, or a flag that
- 17 is authorized by law of the United States or of this State.

(b) For exhibition or display, a person may not place or cause to be placed a we figure, mark, picture, design, or advertisement of any nature on a flag.
(c) A person may not publicly exhibit a flag with a word, figure, mark, pictodesign, or advertisement printed, painted, or produced on or attached to the flag.
(d) A person may not publicly display for sale, manufacture, or otherwise, or sigure, or possess for sale or for use as a gift or for any other purpose, an article merchandise or receptacle on which a flag is produced or attached to advertise, decorate mark the merchandise.
(e) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on convict is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500.]
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effoctober 1, 2016.
