BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 13–212.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement Volume) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - State Finance and Procurement** 13-212.1.
