- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- On or before January 1, 2016, the Maryland Police Training Commission shall
- 23 develop and publish online a policy for the issuance and use of a body-worn camera by a
- 24 law enforcement officer that addresses:



- 1 (1) the testing of body-worn cameras to ensure adequate functioning; 2 (2)the procedure for the law enforcement officer to follow if the camera 3 fails to properly operate at the beginning of or during the law enforcement officer's shift; 4 (3)when recording is mandatory; 5 **(4)** when recording is prohibited; 6 (5)when recording is discretionary; when recording may require consent of a subject being recorded; 7 (6) 8 when a recording may be ended; (7)9 (8)providing notice of recording; 10 (9)access to and confidentiality of recordings; 11 (10)the secure storage of data from a body-worn camera; 12 (11)review and use of recordings; 13 (12)retention of recordings; 14 dissemination and release of recordings; (13)consequences for violations of the agency's body-worn camera policy; 15 (14)16 notification requirements when another individual becomes a party to (15)17 the communication following the initial notification; 18 (16)specific protections for individuals when there is an expectation of 19 privacy in private or public places; and 20 any additional issues determined to be relevant in the implementation 21 and use of body-worn cameras by law enforcement officers. 22 3-511.1. JULY 1, 2016, THE BALTIMORE COUNTY POLICE 23 ON OR BEFORE 24DEPARTMENT SHALL:

- 1 (2) ISSUE BODY–WORN CAMERAS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS 2 TO USE WHILE ON DUTY.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 4 $\,$ 1, 2016.
