 5 THE PERSON IS A HEALTH PRACTITIONER;

6 (2) FILE A COMPLAINT WITH THE APPROPRIATE LAW ENFORCEMENT 7 AGENCY IF THE PERSON IS A POLICE OFFICER; OR
