1 AN ACT concerning

2 Birth Certificates – Homeless Individuals – Prohibition on Collection of Fee


- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene from 4 collecting a fee for a certain copy of a birth certificate issued to a homeless individual; 5 requiring the Department to accept a signed written statement from a homeless individual as proof of homelessness; and generally relating to prohibiting the 6 7 collection of fees for copies of birth certificates issued to homeless individuals.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 13
- 14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General 15

- 17 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the Secretary shall provide, on request, any person authorized by regulations adopted under this subtitle with 18 19 a certified or abridged copy of a birth, death, or fetal death certificate registered under this 20 subtitle or of the certificate of a marriage performed after June 1, 1951.
- 21Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, a local health 22 department may:



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confidential medical information that appears on the birth certificate.

1 Birth certificate information may not be given if it is to be used for (3)2 commercial solicitation or private gain. 3 A noncertified copy of a birth certificate including confidential medical 4 information may be provided to a unit of the Department to carry out its legal mandate or 5 to conduct Institutional Review Board (IRB) approved research or study. Any report resulting from this research or study may not contain personal identifiers unless authorized 6 by the subject of the record or the subject's parent or authorized representative. 7 8 A copy of a birth certificate may be given to the Maryland Immunization 9 Program to improve childhood immunization rates. 10 (c) (1) Except as otherwise provided by law: (i) The Department shall collect a \$12 fee: 11 12 1. For each certified or abridged copy of a fetal death, 13 marriage, or divorce verification certificate; 14 For a report that a search of the fetal death, marriage, or 2. divorce verification certificate files was made and the requested record is not on file; 15 16 For each change to a fetal death, marriage, or divorce 3. 17 verification certificate made later than one year after the certificate has been registered 18 with the Department; or 19 4. To process an adoption, foreign adoption, or legitimation; 20(ii) The Department shall collect a \$24 fee: 21 [For] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (6)(II) OF 1. 22THIS SUBSECTION, FOR each certified or abridged copy of a birth certificate; 23 2.For the first copy of a certified or abridged death certificate 24issued in a single transaction; 25 3. For a report that a search of the birth or death certificate files was made and the requested record is not on file; or 2627 4. For each change to a birth or death certificate made later 28 than 1 year after the certificate has been registered with the Department; and 29 The Department shall collect a \$12 fee for each additional (iii) 30 certified or abridged copy of a death certificate provided concurrently with an initial

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requested death certificate.

- 1 (2) From the fee the Department collects under paragraph (1) of this 2 subsection, the Department shall transfer the entire fee to the General Fund.
- 3 (3) (i) Any local health department may set and collect a fee for processing and issuing a birth certificate, or for a report that a search of the files was made and the requested record is not on file, that covers:
- 6 1. The administrative costs of providing this service; and
- 7 2. The requirements of subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph.
- 8 (ii) The fee set by the local health department for processing and 9 issuing a birth certificate or for a report under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph may not 10 exceed the actual costs to the local health department for processing and issuing a birth 11 certificate or a report.
- 12 (iii) From the fee the local health department collects under 13 subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, \$20 shall be transferred to the General Fund.
- 14 (iv) Prior to setting and collecting a fee for processing and issuing a 15 birth certificate or for a report under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, the local health 16 department shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Department of 17 Health and Mental Hygiene that outlines the local health department's fee structure.
- 18 (4) The Department or a local health department may collect a fee for a 19 certificate requested by an agency of the State or any of its political subdivisions.
- 20 (5) The Secretary may waive all or part of a fee if chargeable to an agency 21 of the United States.
- 22 (6) (I) The Department may not collect a fee for a copy of a vital record 23 issued to:
- 24 [(i)] 1. A current or former member of the armed forces of the 25 United States; or
- 26 **[**(ii)**] 2.** The surviving spouse or child of the member, if the copy will be used in connection with a claim for a dependent or beneficiary of the member.
- 28 (II) 1. THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT COLLECT A FEE FOR A 29 CERTIFIED OR AN ABRIDGED COPY OF A BIRTH CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO A 30 HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL.
- 2. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ACCEPT A SIGNED WRITTEN STATEMENT FROM A HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS HOMELESS AS PROOF OF HOMELESSNESS.

1 (d) (1) Any local health department may set and collect a fee for processing 2 and issuing a death certificate that covers the administrative costs of providing this service.

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- (2) The fee set by the local health department for processing and issuing a death certificate under this subsection may not exceed the actual costs to the local health department for processing and issuing a death certificate.
- (e) The Secretary shall include with every copy of a death certificate, in a form prescribed and provided by the Insurance Commissioner, a notice which advises that certain individuals may be entitled to continuation of group health insurance benefits under § 15–407 of the Insurance Article.
- 10 (f) The Secretary shall include with every copy of a death certificate that is completed by the Chief Medical Examiner a notice that advises a person in interest, as defined in § 4–101(g) of the General Provisions Article, of the right to appeal a denial by the Chief Medical Examiner of a request to correct findings and conclusions as to the cause and manner of death recorded on a death certificate as provided under § 5–310(d) of this article.
- 16 (g) A person may use a photocopy of a birth, death, fetal death, or marriage certificate for any nonfraudulent and nondeceptive purpose.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
