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Birth Certificates - Homeless Individuals - Prohibition on Collection of Fee

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene from 4 collecting a fee for a certain copy of a birth certificate issued to a homeless individual; 5 requiring the Department to accept a signed written statement from a homeless 6 individual as proof of homelessness a certain statement from a certain homeless 7 services provider; providing that a homeless individual may receive one copy of a 8 birth certificate without a fee in a certain transaction; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; defining a certain term; and generally relating to 9 10 prohibiting the collection of fees for copies of birth certificates issued to homeless individuals. 11


