### 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Edward T. and Mary A. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program – Eligibility

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the eligibility requirements for the Edward T. and Mary A. 4 Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program to include veterans and members of the  $\mathbf{5}$ armed forces who have served or are currently serving on active duty for a minimum 6 period of time; altering the eligibility requirements for the Conroy Memorial 7 Scholarship Program to include certain children and spouses of veterans and 8 members of the armed forces who have served or are currently serving on active duty 9 for a minimum period of time; repealing certain limitations on the eligibility of certain veterans and the number of veterans that are eligible to receive a Conrov 10 11 Memorial Scholarship; limiting the amount of an award under the Conroy Memorial 12Scholarship Program for certain students under certain circumstances; defining a 13 certain term; making certain stylistic and conforming changes; and generally 14relating to eligibility for the Edward T. and Mary A. Conroy Memorial Scholarship 15Program.

Cryor Scholarship Fund.  $\mathbf{2}$ (2)The Commission shall administer the Fund. 3 The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to 7–302 of (3)4 the State Finance and Procurement Article.  $\mathbf{5}$ (4) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund and the Comptroller shall 6 account for the Fund. 7The Commission: (5)8 May accept any gift or grant from any person for the Fund; (i) 9 Shall use any gift or grant that it receives for a scholarship from (ii) the programs; and 10 11 (iii) Shall deposit any gift or grant that it receives for the programs 12with the State Treasurer.
