## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Public Health - Hydraulic Fracturing Chemicals - Information and Fund

3 FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for a certain permit for the hydraulic fracturing 4 of a well for the exploration or production of natural gas to submit certain 5 information to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene in a certain manner; 6 requiring the Department to provide access to certain information to the Maryland 7 Poison Control Center and certain health care providers; authorizing a certain 8 health care provider to provide certain information in a certain manner; requiring a 9 certain health care provider, health professional, or government agency to maintain information and medical records in a certain manner; requiring the Department to 10 11 establish a certain educational program for certain purposes; establishing the 12 Hydraulic Fracturing Chemical Education and Impact Fund as a special, nonlapsing 13 fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Department to administer 14 the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to 15 account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; specifying the purpose for 16 which the Fund may be used; providing for the investment of money in and 17 expenditures from the Fund; requiring the Department to establish a certain fee by 18 regulation; establishing a certain civil penalty for certain violations; requiring the 19 civil penalty to be deposited in the Fund; requiring the Department to adopt certain 20 regulations; exempting the Fund from a certain provision of law that requires 21 interest on State money in special funds to accrue to the General Fund; defining 22 certain terms; and generally relating to chemicals used in hydraulic fracturing.

THE ENVIRONMENT ARTICLE FOR THE HYDRAULIC FRACTURING OF A WELL SHALL

SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT IN A MANNER DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT:

- 1 (I) Information relating to each chemical 2 constituent or other distinct material, including proppants and 3 engineered nanomaterials that will be used in the hydraulic 4 fracturing of the well, including:
- 5 THE NAME OF THE CHEMICAL CONSTITUENT OR 6 OTHER DISTINCT MATERIAL;
- 7 2. A. THE CHEMICAL ABSTRACT SERVICE NUMBER 8 FOR THE CHEMICAL CONSTITUENT; OR
- 9 B. IF A CHEMICAL ABSTRACT SERVICE NUMBER DOES 10 NOT EXIST, A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER FOR THE CHEMICAL CONSTITUENT, IF AVAILABLE; 11 AND
- 3. THE MAXIMUM CONCENTRATION, IN PERCENT BY MASS, OF THE CHEMICAL CONSTITUENT OR OTHER DISTINCT MATERIAL;
- 14 (II) 1. THE LOCATION OF THE PORTION OF THE WELL IN WHICH THE HYDRAULIC FRACTURING WILL TAKE PLACE; AND
- 16 2. THE ANTICIPATED EXTENT OF THE FRACTURES OR OTHER MODIFICATIONS TO THE SHALE OR UNDERGROUND GEOLOGIC FORMATION;
- 18 (III) HEALTH AND SAFETY DATA RELATING TO THE CHEMICALS
  19 THAT WILL BE USED IN THE HYDRAULIC FRACTURING OF THE WELL, INCLUDING
  20 TOXICOLOGICAL, EPIDEMIOLOGICAL, AND EXPOSURE–RELATED INFORMATION; AND
- 21 (IV) INFORMATION ON CHEMICAL CHANGES THAT MAY OCCUR 22 AS A RESULT OF THE HYDRAULIC FRACTURING OF THE WELL, INCLUDING 23 INFORMATION ON CHEMICAL REACTIONS TO OTHER CHEMICALS OR SUBSTANCES.
- 24 (2) A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OR RECKLESSLY SUBMIT FALSE 25 INFORMATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.
- 26 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ACCESS TO THE INFORMATION 27 COLLECTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(1) OF THIS SECTION:
- 28 (1) TO THE MARYLAND POISON CENTER;
- 29 (2) ON REQUEST, TO A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER THAT SUSPECTS A
  30 PATIENT MAY HAVE A DISEASE, AN ILLNESS, OR AN INJURY CAUSED BY A CHEMICAL
  31 USED IN HYDRAULIC FRACTURING; AND

- 1 (3) A PUBLIC HEALTH PROFESSIONAL, TOXICOLOGIST, OR 2 EPIDEMIOLOGIST THAT:
- 3 (I) IS EMPLOYED IN THE FIELD OF PUBLIC HEALTH; AND
- 4 (II) SUBMITS A WRITTEN STATEMENT OF NEED FOR THE 5 INFORMATION TO THE DEPARTMENT.
- 6 (C) A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER MAY PROVIDE THE INFORMATION RECEIVED 7 UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION AS PROFESSIONALLY NECESSARY, 8 INCLUDING TO:
- 9 (1) THE PATIENT;
- 10 (2) ANY OTHER HEALTH PROFESSIONAL INVOLVED IN THE
- 11 TREATMENT OF THE PATIENT, INCLUDING A TOXICOLOGIST OR PUBLIC HEALTH
- 12 EPIDEMIOLOGIST;
- 13 (3) A FAMILY MEMBER OF THE PATIENT IF THE PATIENT IS UNABLE
- 14~ TO MAKE MEDICAL DECISIONS OR IS A MINOR; AND
- 15 (4) THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION OR ANY 16 OTHER GOVERNMENT PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY.

- 28 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO ADDRESS THE POTENTIAL HEALTH 29 RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH CHEMICALS USED IN HYDRAULIC FRACTURING.

(C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND. 1 2 THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE. 3 THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND SEPARATELY, 4 AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND. 5 **(E)** THE FUND CONSISTS OF: 6 7 REVENUE DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND UNDER § 22–705 OF THIS **(1)** 8 SUBTITLE; 9 **(2)** PENALTIES COLLECTED UNDER § 22-706 OF THIS SUBTITLE; MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE FUND; 10 **(3)** ANY INVESTMENT EARNINGS OF THE FUND; AND 11 **(4)** 12 ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND. 13 THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR: 14 **(F)** FINANCING AN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM REQUIRED UNDER § 15 **(1)** 16 22-703 OF THIS SUBTITLE; 17 PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS 18 AN ILLNESS OR INJURY CAUSED BY A CHEMICAL USED IN HYDRAULIC FRACTURING; 19 **AND** 20 **(3)** THE REASONABLE COSTS OF ADMINISTERING THE FUND. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND 21IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED. 22
