FOR the purpose of repealing a certain provision of law that limits a distillery license holder
to selling product and related merchandise to an individual on a guided tour of the
distillery only if the license holder manufactures not more than a certain gallonage
annually; and generally relating to sales of alcoholic beverages by holders of
distillery licenses.
