1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Tort Claims Act – Certain Claim Requirement – Exception**

3 FOR the purpose of providing a certain exception to a requirement that a claimant submit
4 a claim within a certain time to the State Treasurer or a designee of the State
5 Treasurer under the Maryland Tort Claims Act; providing for the application of this
6 Act; and generally relating to repealing a certain requirement for certain claims
7 under the Maryland Tort Claims Act.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – State Government**

2 (a) This section does not apply to a claim that is asserted by cross-claim,
3 counterclaim, or third-party claim.

4 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a claimant may not
5 institute an action under this subtitle unless:

6 (1) the claimant submits a written claim to the Treasurer or a designee of
7 the Treasurer within 1 year after the injury to person or property that is the basis of the
8 claim;

9 (2) the Treasurer or designee denies the claim finally; and

10 (3) the action is filed within 3 years after the cause of action arises.

11 (c) (1) If a claimant fails to submit a written claim in accordance with
12 subsection (b)(1) of this section, on motion by a claimant and for good cause shown, the
13 court may entertain an action under this subtitle unless the State can affirmatively show
14 that its defense has been prejudiced by the claimant's failure to submit the claim.

17 (I) A CLAIM CONCERNING AN ALLEGED DISCRIMINATORY ACT

20 (II) A CLAIM FILED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY OTHER
21 PROVISION OF LAW THAT PROHIBITS DISCRIMINATION OR RETALIATION AND
22 REQUIRES THE CLAIMANT TO FILE AN ADMINISTRATIVE CHARGE OR COMPLAINT
23 BEFORE FILING A CIVIL ACTION.

25 (a) Any person claiming to be aggrieved by an alleged discriminatory act may file
26 a complaint with the Commission.

27 (b) The complaint shall:

28 (1) be in writing;

29 (2) state:

1 (i) the name and address of the person or State or local unit alleged
2 to have committed the discriminatory act; and

3 (ii) the particulars of the alleged discriminatory act;

4 (3) contain any other information required by the Commission; and

5 (4) be signed by the complainant under oath.

6 (c) (1) A complaint shall be filed within 6 months after the date on which the
7 alleged discriminatory act occurred.

8 (2) A complaint filed with a federal or local human relations commission
9 within 6 months after the date on which the alleged discriminatory act occurred shall be
10 deemed to have complied with this subsection.

11 (d) The Commission, on its own motion, and by action of at least three
12 commissioners, may issue a complaint in its name in the same manner as if the complaint
13 had been filed by an individual, if:

14 (1) the Commission has received reliable information from an individual
15 that a person has been or is engaged in a discriminatory act; and

16 (2) after a preliminary investigation by the Commission’s staff authorized
17 by the chair or vice-chair, the Commission is satisfied that the information warrants the
18 filing of a complaint.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to
20 apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or
21 application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act.

22 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 October 1, 2016.
