2 Prescription Drug Repository Program – Repository Inventory Requirement – Revision

FOR the purpose of requiring a repository that participates in the Prescription Drug Repository Program to maintain a separate inventory of donated prescription drugs and medical supplies that the repository intends to dispense under a certain provision of law, instead of a separate inventory of all donated prescription drugs and medical supplies; and generally relating to the Prescription Drug Repository Program.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.

- 24 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.



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(C) OF THIS SECTION:

- 2 1 "Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy. (b) 2 "Program" means the Prescription Drug Repository Program. (d) "Repository" means a licensed pharmacy that: 3 (e) 4 (1) Does not have a final disciplinary order issued against it by the Board of Pharmacy; 5 6 Has voluntarily agreed to participate in the Program; and (2) Has been approved by the Board to: 7 (3)8 (i) Accept donated prescription drugs or medical supplies from a 9 designated drop-off site; 10 (ii) Dispense the donated prescription drugs or medical supplies to 11 needy individuals; or 12 Dispose of prescription drugs or medical supplies not accepted for (iii) dispensing to needy individuals. 13 14 15–605. The Board may approve Medbank of Maryland, Inc., or another licensed 15 16 pharmacy, to be a repository. Consistent with its approval by the Board, a repository shall: 17 (b) 18 **(1)** Accept only donated prescription drugs and medical supplies forwarded 19 by designated drop-off sites; 20 Inspect all donated prescription drugs and medical supplies; (2) 21 Accept for dispensing to needy individuals only those donated 22prescription drugs and medical supplies that meet the requirements of § 15-603 of this 23subtitle: 24 **(4)** Dispose of donated prescription drugs and medical supplies not 25accepted for dispensing to needy individuals in accordance with State and federal law;
- 29 Store donated prescription drugs and medical supplies in a secure 30 location used exclusively for the Program;

medical supplies THAT THE REPOSITORY INTENDS TO DISPENSE UNDER SUBSECTION

Maintain a separate inventory of donated prescription drugs and

- Maintain separate prescription files for patients receiving donated 1 2 prescription drugs and medical supplies; and 3 Obliterate from the labels of donated prescription drugs and medical 4 supplies any information specific to the patient for whom the donated prescription drugs and medical supplies were originally dispensed. 5 6 A repository shall dispense donated prescription drugs and medical supplies (c) 7 only: 8 (1) To an individual who meets the requirements of § 15-606 of this 9 subtitle; 10 (2)On a new prescription, in the case of a prescription drug or medical 11 supply that requires a prescription; and 12(3) In accordance with State and federal laws pertaining to: 13 (i) Storage, distribution, and dispensing of prescription drugs; and Confidentiality of patient information. 14 (ii) 15 (d) A repository may: 16 Charge a fee, not to exceed \$10, for each prescription drug or medical 17 supply dispensed; and 18 Dispense a donated prescription drug or medical supply by mail, 19 provided that the repository informs the patient that a delay may be entailed. 20 A repository may not establish or maintain a waiting list for any prescription 21drug or medical supply dispensed by the Program. 22 A pharmacy may accept prescription drugs and medical supplies taken to the pharmacy for disposal only if the pharmacy is approved by the Board as a repository for 2324this purpose.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.

The Program may not require a private entity to establish, operate, or fund a

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drop-off site or disposal program.
