## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Election Law – Special Elections – Absentee Ballots for Absent Uniformed Services Voters and Overseas Voters

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a county council to set the date for a special election to fill a  $\mathbf{5}$ vacancy in certain county offices that allows the local board of elections time to 6 provide absentee ballots for the special election to absent uniformed services voters 7 and overseas voters at least a certain number of days before the special election; 8 requiring the State Administrator of Elections to require local boards of elections to 9 provide absentee ballots for a special election to fill a vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress to absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters 1011 at least a certain number of days before the special election; altering the time frame 12within which the Governor may set by proclamation the date for a special primary 13 election and a special general election to fill a vacancy in the office of Representative 14 in Congress; requiring the State Board of Elections to adopt regulations concerning 15notice and the process for voting by absentee ballot in special elections by absent 16uniformed services voters and overseas voters; and generally relating to absentee 17voting in special elections by absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

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1 (a) A special primary election and a special general election may be held at a time 2 other than the date of a regular primary election and a regular general election:

(1) to fill a vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress; or

4 (2) to fill a vacancy in the county council or in the office of chief executive 5 officer or county executive if the charter of that county provides for special elections.

6 (b) (1) Special elections to fill a vacancy in the office of Representative in 7 Congress shall be held at the time specified in Subtitle 7 of this title.

8 (2) (I) Special elections to fill vacancies in a county council or in the 9 office of chief executive officer or county executive shall be held as provided in the county 10 charter.

11 (II) THE DATE SET FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION TO FILL A 12 VACANCY UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL ALLOW AT LEAST 45 DAYS BETWEEN THE 13 DATE A LOCAL BOARD MAKES AN ABSENTEE BALLOT AVAILABLE TO AN ABSENT 14 UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER, AS DEFINED UNDER THE 15 UNIFORMED AND OVERSEAS CITIZENS ABSENTEE VOTING ACT, AND THE DATE OF 16 THE SPECIAL ELECTION.

17 (c) An election to fill a vacancy in the office of United States Senator shall be held 18 concurrently with a regular election as provided in Subtitle 6 of this title.

19 (D) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH 20 REQUIREMENTS CONCERNING:

21(1) NOTICE TO ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTERS AND22OVERSEAS VOTERS CONCERNING A SPECIAL GENERAL ELECTION; AND

(2) THE PROCESS FOR THE ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR
 OVERSEAS VOTER TO REQUEST AND RETURN THE ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR THE
 SPECIAL ELECTION IN A TIMELY MANNER.

(a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, if there is a
vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress, the Governor shall issue a
proclamation, within 10 days after the date that the vacancy occurs or becomes known to
the Governor, declaring that a special primary election and a special general election shall
be held to fill the vacancy.

32 (2) If the vacancy occurs during the period beginning 60 days before the 33 regular primary election and ending on the last day of the term, the Governor may:

2		(ii) allow the office to remain vacant for the remainder of the term.

4 (2) A vote cast for a candidate in the merged primary election shall be 5 deemed a vote for that candidate in both the special primary election and the regular 6 primary election.

7 (3) Two certificates of nomination, one for the special primary election and 8 one for the regular primary election, shall be issued to each candidate nominated in the 9 merged primary election.

Notwithstanding any provision of this article:

(i) a nominee for the special primary election may decline the
nomination by notifying the State Board not later than 5 p.m. on the Wednesday following
the primary election;

14 (ii) the appropriate political party shall fill the vacancy in 15 nomination not later than 5 p.m. on the Thursday following the primary election; and

16 (iii) a petition for recount and recanvass of the special primary 17 election shall be filed not later than 5 p.m. on the Wednesday following the primary 18 election.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 2016.

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
