- WHEREAS, Community colleges offer the most affordable form of higher education in the State; and
- WHEREAS, Community colleges are currently limited to awarding 2-year associate's degrees; and
- WHEREAS, To make bachelor's degrees affordable to more citizens of the State, the College of Southern Maryland should have the option of offering 4-year bachelor's degree programs that include online courses to students to accomplish that goal; now, therefore,
- 8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 9 That Section(s) 16–610 of Article – Education of the Annotated Code of Maryland be 10 renumbered to be Section(s) 16–611.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article Education
- 14 10-210.
- 15 (b) **(1)** The community colleges of the State shall:
- 16 **[**(1)**] (I)** Provide a core curriculum of general education, including courses 17 in the arts and sciences, that should be available to all students;
- 18 **[(2)] (II)** Provide lower level undergraduate courses, in accordance with credit transfer guidelines set by the Maryland Higher Education Commission, for students who aspire to continue their education at a senior institution;
- [(3)] (III) Provide technical and career education programs;
- [(4)] (IV) Provide training in skills and fields of study of importance to the region's business community;
- 24 **[(5)] (V)** Provide a wide variety of continuing education programs to 25 benefit citizens of the community;
- 26 [(6)] (VI) Provide developmental and remedial education for citizens with 27 needs in these areas; and
- 28 [(7)] (VII) Provide public services to the community's citizens.

12 13 14 15	(B) IF THE COLLEGE CHOOSES TO OFFER BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS AND AWARD BACHELOR'S DEGREES, THE COLLEGE, IN COORDINATION WITH THE SECRETARY, SHALL ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMS AND THE AWARDING OF BACHELOR'S DEGREES AT THE COLLEGE.
