3 FOR the purpose of clarifying the license renewal process for licensed physicians; providing that certain licensed physicians and allied health professionals regulated by the 4 5 State Board of Physicians have a certain grace period, under certain circumstances, 6 to renew a license retroactively; providing that, after a certain grace period has 7 ended, certain licenses lapse into a nonrenewal status; authorizing the Board to 8 require certain former licensees to meet certain requirements to be reinstated after 9 a certain grace period has ended; and generally relating to license renewal by the State Board of Physicians. 10
